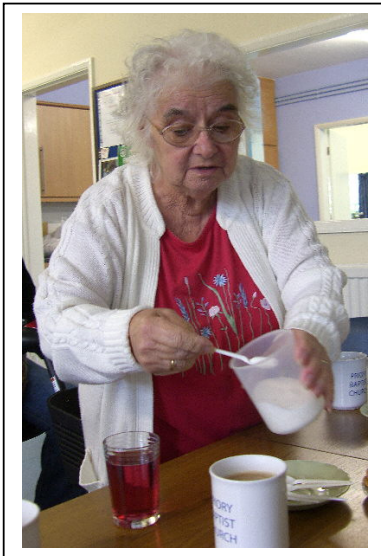

"I value the friendship, finding out how people are, and discovering things which are going on at the church"

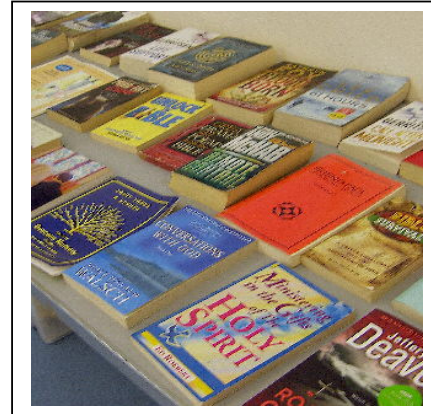
"It is a nice place to come and meet nice people"
